GUY LORD DORCHESTER GOVERNOR.

- T the Provincial Parliament, begun and holden at Quebec, the seventeenth day of December, Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, in the thirty-third Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland KING, Defender of the faith, &c.
- And from thence continued by feveral Prorogations to the eleventh day of November, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, being the second Session of the first Provincial Parliament of Lower-Canada.

C A P. I.

An Acr to provide for the *Publication of certain Laws*, and for the printing and distributing to certain persons, for the purpose of public information, all Laws that have been, and shall be passed in the Legislature of this Province, under the present Constitution.

Preamble.

ATHEREAS certain laws have been passed in the first Session of the Legislature, under the present Constitution, in the first enacting clause whereof are these words, " from and after the Publication of this Act," which form of expression has created and may create doubts, as to the commencement of the operation of fuch laws; in order therefore to remove such doubts, Be it cnacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great-Britain, passed in the thirty-sirst Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an "Alt, passed in the fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign" " intituled " An Act for mak-" ing more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, " and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province." And it is hereby enacted by authority of the same, that all laws, passed in the last Session of the Legislature of this Province, shall be deemed and considered to have had full force and effect from the day of paffing the same; any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

All laws passed in the first Session of the Legislature of this Province shall take essential take essential take essential take.

All laws shall be printed to foon after being pailed as may be, hy the Government prin-

And Copies of all fuch laws shall be transmitted to the Governor, &... the members of the Legislature, and of the Executive Council.

The Judges and Clerks of the Courts, Sheriffs, Coroners, Justices of the Peace, the Field Officers and Captains of Militia.

One copy only to be transmitted to the same perfon.

II. And for the general information of the Public, Be it further enacted by the fame authority, that all laws which have been or may hereafter be passed, in the Legislature of this Province, under its present Constitution, shall be printed with all convenient speed; after they have received the Assent of His-Majesty's Representative, by such printer or printers, as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person having the administration of the Government of this Province for the time being, shall employ for that purpose.

III. And as it is expedient, that there should be a further and more ample means of the Public having information of the laws, that have been or may be palled in the Legislature aforesaid, it is also enacted by the same authority, that as soon after the end of each Session as can conveniently be effected, copies of the laws passed. therein, so printed in both languages, shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the Legislative Council, to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, to the members of the Legislature, and of His Majesty's Executive Council, to the Judges and Clerks of the courts, to the Sheriffs, Coroners and Justices of the Peace, to the Field Officers and Captains of Militia, of each parish in this Province, and on the death or dismission of any Captain of Militia, then the same to be delivered over to his successor in office: Provided always, that only one copy thereof in both languages, shall be transmitted to. the same person, at the public expence.

An Acr to facilitate the Negotiation of Promissory Notes.

Preamble.

All Promissory Notes figned by any person, shall be held to be duc to the person, to whom inade pay-And all Promiffory Notes payable to order, shall be assignable hy indorsement, spe-

induried on every new transfer thereof.

The payee may main aman aftion again, the drawer.

HEREAS it will tend to the encouragement of trade and commerce within this Province, that the Negotiation of Promissory Notes be facilitated, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the thirty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign' intitie-" led " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of " Quelec in North America and to make further provision for the Government of the Said " Province." And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, all Notes in writing, commonly called Promissory Notes, hereafter to be made and figned by any person or persons, or by his, her or their Attorney or Attornies, legally authorised to fign such Promissory Notes for him, her or them; whereby such person or persons, his, her or their Attorney or Attornies, as aforesaid, shall promise to pay to any other person or persons, his, her or their order, any sum of money mentioned in such Promissory Note, shall be taken and construed to be, by virtue thereof, due and payable to any fuch person or persons to whom the fame shall be made payable, and also every such Promissory Note, payable to any cifying the day of . person or persons, his, her or their order; shall be assignable and indorseable over to any other person or persons, by an indorsement, or assignment written and signed affigament, &c. on such Promissory Note, specifying the date of such indorsement, the name of the person or persons, to whom or to whose order such Note is indorsed, and that such trans-And that he to fer is made for value received; and fhall, by every new holder or holders under fuch indorsement or assignment as aforesaid, be further indorseable and assignable to any other person or persons, in the like manner, as often as the case may require: and that the person or persons to whom such sum of money shall be, by such Promissory Note, made payable, shall and may maintain an action for the same against the person or perfons
