

enabling the said Society to defray the expenses necessary for the support of the said School;—May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North-America,*" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;—And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, to advance by an Order or Warrant under his hand and seal, out of the unappropriated monies which now are in or hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver-General of this Province for the time being, a sum of money not exceeding two hundred pounds, currency, to the Committee of the said Society of Education for the District of Quebec, or to the President of the said Society, to be by the said Committee applied to the support of the School by them established in Quebec, and towards enabling them to defray the expenses necessary for that purpose.

£300 granted to the committee or to the President of the Society of Education of the District of Quebec, for the support of a school in the said city.

Expenditure of the money to be accounted for to His Majesty.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies that may be paid under and by virtue of this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, his heirs and successors may be pleased to direct.

### CAP. XXXV.

An Act to continue for a limited time and amend an Act passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the maintenance of good order in Churches, Chapels and other places used for Public Worship, and for repealing an Act therein-mentioned.

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to continue for a limited time and to amend an Act passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An

“ An Act for the maintenance of good order in Churches, Chapels and other places used for Public Worship, and for repealing an Act therein-mentioned,” which said Act will expire on the first day of May next ;— Be it therefore enacted by the King’s Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative-Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, “ An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty’s Reign, intituled, “ *An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North-America,*” and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province”—And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the first year of His Majesty’s Reign, intituled, “ An Act for the maintenance of good order in Churches, Chapels and other places used for Public Worship, and for repealing an Act therein-mentioned,” as hereby amended, shall as well as this Act continue be and remain in full force and effect until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and no longer.

Act 1st Geo. IV. cap. 1st, continued and amended.

Persons offending, although not forthwith arrested, may be sued within one month after the offence committed, &c.

II. And whereas doubts have arisen on the interpretation of the second clause or section of the aforesaid Act, be it therefore declared and further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that any person or persons offending as in the said clause or section mentioned, although not forthwith arrested, may, nevertheless, be sued at any time within one month after the Commission of the offence, before any Justice of the Peace, and upon conviction be fined and imprisoned as in and by the said Act, it is specified and provided.

### CAP. XXXVI.

An Act to extend the provisions of an Act therein-mentioned, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty’s Reign, Chapter twenty-second, in favor of the Proprietors of the Montreal Library.

(9th March, 1824.)

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to extend the period assigned by an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty’s Reign, Chapter twenty-second, to the “ Company of Proprietors of the Montreal Library,” for erecting and building the intended Public Library, as in the fourth clause or section of
