HEREAS it is expedient to amend an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act further to regulate persons who keep Houses of Public Entertainment, and retail Spirituous Liquors, and for other purposes;" Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled,
