

The Provincial Statutes of Lower-Canada, Being the fourth session of the eleventh Provincial Parliament of Lower-Canada. Quebec: P. E. Desbarats, Printer to the King's Most Excellent Majesty, 1824.

4 George IV – Chapter 38

An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money therein-mentioned, for the payment of the printing of certain Acts of the Legislature of this Province. (9th March, 1924.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas a balance of four hundred and eleven pounds five shillings, currency, remains due and unpaid to Peter Edward Desbarats, His Majesty's Law Printer, for printing different Acts of the Legislature, between the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, and the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight-hundred and twenty-three; and whereas it is expedient to provide for the payment of the said sum remaining due and unpaid—May it therefore please Your Majesty that may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North-America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time beings by a Warrant under his hand, to advance and pay out of the unappropriated monies that now are or that hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver-General of the Province for the time being, to Peter Edward Desbarats, His Majesty's Law Printer, the sum of four hundred and eleven pounds five shillings, current money of this Province, being the amount of the balance remain due and unpaid to the said Peter Edward Desbarats, for printing different Acts of the Legislature, between the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, and the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the sum of money by this Act authorised to be paid, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his heirs and successors shall be pleased to direct.
