5 George IV – Chapter 21

An Act to continue certain Acts therein-mentioned, relating to the Militia of this Province. (22d. March, 1825.)

Whereas it is expedient still further to continue for a limited time an Act passed in the forty third year of the Reign of His Majesty George the third, intituled, "An Act for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts or Ordinances therein-mentioned," as amended by two several Acts, that is to say by an Act passed in the fifty-seventh year of His late Majesty's Reign aforesaid, intituled, "An Act for reviving and continuing for a limited time, and amending an Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts or Ordinances therein-mentioned,'" and by an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the Reign of His late Majesty aforesaid, intituled, "An Act further to continue for a limited time, and to amend an Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts or Ordinances therein-mentioned,'" the duration of which said Acts is limited to the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five; Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the forty-third year of the Reign of His late Majesty, George the Third, intituled, "An Act for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts or Ordinances therein-mentioned," as amended by the above recited Act, passed in the fifty-seventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty aforesaid, intituled, "An Act for reviving and continuing for a limited time, and amending, an Act, passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts or Ordinances therein-mentioned,'" and by an Act passed in the fifty- ninth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, aforesaid, intituled, "An Act further to continue for a limited time, and to amend an Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts for Ordinances therein-mentioned,'" and all and every the Clauses, Provisions, Powers, Authorities, Directions and Regulations in the said Several contained, shall be, and the same is, and are hereby further continued in full force and effect until the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and no longer.

II. And whereas it is expedient to repeal an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty to Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue and amend three certain Acts, therein-mentioned, for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province;" Be it therefore further enacted by the authority aforesaid,

that the said Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to continue and amend three certain Acts therein-mentioned, for the better regulation of the Militia of this Province," and all and every the provisions, matters and things in the said Act contained, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed from the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five.
