5 George IV – Chapter 9

An Act to appropriate certain sums of Money therein-mentioned, towards the encouragement of Education. (22d. March, 1825.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

Whereas the Institution of the Society of Education, in the District of Quebec, as well as that of the British and Canadian School Society at Montreal, is extremely advantageous to the Public, and it is therefore expedient to appropriate a certain sum of Money as an aid towards enabling, the said Societies to defray the necessary expences of supporting their respective Schools: May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to advance by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand from and out of the unappropriated monies which now are or hereafter shall come into the hands of the Receiver-General of the Province, for the time being, a sum of money not exceeding four hundred pounds currency, one, half whereof shall be paid to each of the Committees or Presidents of the said Societies, respectively to be by the said Committees respectively employed towards the support of their Schools at Quebec and Montreal, and to aid them in defraying the expences necessary for that purpose.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the Monies appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
