authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " *An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,*" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province ;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand, to issue and pay from and out of the unappropriated monies, in the hands of the Receiver General of the Province, a sum of money not exceeding five hundred pounds currency, towards covering the sum of forty-three pounds, twelve shillings and five pence currency, already expended for repairs on the said *Temiscouata* Road, and for making further repairs upon the same ; an account of the expenditure and application of which said sum of money upon the said road, shall, in detail be laid before the three branches of the Legislature within fifteen days after the opening of the next Session thereof.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the money hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.

C A P. XIX.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain Sum of Money to indemnify the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the proportion of the Revenue appertaining to Upper-Canada.

(29th March, 1826.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN ;

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a certain Sum of Money to indemnify the Honorable John Hale, and John Richardson, and Robert Morrogh, Esquire, for their disbursements as Commissioners for regulating the proportion

proportion of the revenue appertaining to Upper-Canada; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America*;" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to pay by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand, a sum not exceeding three hundred pounds currency, out of the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of the Province for the time being, to indemnify the Honorable John Hale and John Richardson, and Robert Morrogh, Esquire for expences and disbursements in the years one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four and one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, as Commissioners for regulating the proportion of the Revenues appertaining to Upper-Canada, at the rate of one hundred pounds currency, each.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the aforesaid sum of money, shall be accounted for to His Majesty His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.

C A P. XX.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain Sum of Money in aid of the Corporation of the General Hospital, at Montreal.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN;

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a Sum of Money as an aid to the Corporation of the General Hospital at Montreal: May it therefore please
