6 George IV – Chapter 14

An Act to appropriate certain Sums of Money therein-mentioned, towards the encouragement of Education in the District of Quebec. (29th March, 1826.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate certain sums of Money for the encouragement of Education: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to advance by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand the following sums in the course of the present year, from and out of the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province for the purposes herein-mentioned, that is to say: To the Society of Education for the District of Quebec, the sum of two hundred pounds, currency, to assist the said society in promoting and extending Education in this Province, and to the said society the sum of three hundred pounds currency, to assist the same in building at Quebec a central School House for the District of Quebec, which said sums shall be paid to the President of the aforesaid Institution in such payments as shall be deemed necessary, and shall be by him and the permanent committee of the said society applied and expended for the purposes aforesaid according to and in conformity with the rules and regulations of the said society.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the person or persons having the direction of the said Schools, shall report on the state of the said Schools and render an account of the expenditure of the monies granted by this Act, to the three Branches of the Provincial Parliament, within the first fifteen days of the Session, now next ensuing.
