6 George IV – Chapter 16

An Act granting a certain Sum of Money therein-mentioned, in aid of the British and Canadian School Society of Quebec. (29th March, 1826.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a certain sum of Money as an aid in support of the British and Canadian School in Quebec: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to advance by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand, from and out of any unappropriated monies that now are or hereafter may come into the hands of the Receiver General of this Province for the time being, a sum of money, in the course of the present year, not exceeding one hundred and fifty pounds currency, as an aid for and towards the support of the British and Canadian School in Quebec, which sum shall be advanced and paid to the President or Principal of the said Institution in such payments as shall be deemed necessary, and shall be by him and the Committee of the said School applied and expended for the purposes aforesaid.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the sum of money hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the person or persons having the direction of the said School, shall report on the state of the said School and render an account of the expenditure of the monies granted by this Act, to the three branches of the Provincial Parliament, within the first fifteen days of the Session now next ensuing.
