6 George IV - Chapter 17

An Act to appropriate certain Sums of Money therein-mentioned towards the encouragement of Education in the City of Montreal. (29th March, 1826.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN;

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate certain Sums of Money towards the encouragement of Education; May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province" —And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to advance by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand the following sums in the course of the present year, from and out of the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of the Province for the several purposes herein-mentioned, that is to say: a sum not exceeding three hundred pounds currency, as an aid to the British and Canadian School Society of Montreal, and a further sum not exceeding four hundred pounds currency, to the said British and Canadian School Society, to assist the same in building a School House at Montreal; and a sum not exceeding two hundred pounds currency, as an aid to the National and Free School at Montreal, which said sums shall be advanced and paid to the Presidents of the respective institutions aforesaid, in such payments as shall be deemed necessary, and which said sums aforesaid shall be by them respectively applied and expended for the purposes aforesaid.

- II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the Monies appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
- III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the person or persons having the direction of the said Schools, shall report on the state of the said Schools and render an account of the expenditure of the monies granted by this Act, to the three Branches of the Provincial Parliament, within the first fifteen days of the Session now next ensuing.
