An Act to provide for the distribution of a certain number of Copies of the Ordinances of the Legislative Council of the late Province of Quebec, as reprinted pursuant to an Act of the Fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter eight. (29th March, 1826.)

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the distribution of a certain number of Copies of the Ordinances of the Legislative Council of the late Province of Quebec as reprinted pursuant to an Act of the fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter eight; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that of the Copies of the aforesaid Ordinances of the Legislative Council of the late Province of Quebec, reprinted pursuant to the aforesaid Act of the fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter eight, a number not exceeding six hundred, shall be and the same are hereby authorized and required to be from and after the passing of this Act, distributed by the proper Officer at the public expense, in like manner as other Acts of the Legislature are distributed among the following Functionaries and Officers of His Majesty, that is to say, a Copy to each of the Members of the Legislature, to each of the Judges in this Province, and to each Justice of the Peace being of the Quorum, and to each Clerk of the Peace, to each Rector, Curate, Vicar, Priest or other Minister in each of the Parishes within this Province, and to each Officer of the Militia Staff, and to each Officer commanding a Division or Battalion of Militia in this Province, and to none others.
