6 George IV – Chapter 30

An Act to appropriate certain Sums of Money towards certain necessary work and repairs in the Common Gaol of the District of Quebec.

29th March 1826. Presented for His Majesty's Assent, and reserved "for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon."

14th March, 1827. Assented to by His Majesty, in His Privy Council.

29th August, 1827. The Royal Assent signified by the Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor in Chief.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN;

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a certain Sum of Money towards certain work and necessary repairs done and to be done in the Common Gaol for the District of Quebec:— May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly, of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to apply and pay by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, a Sum not exceeding Fifteen hundred and seventy- three Pounds, nine shillings and eight pence, Currency, towards making such work and repairs as are necessary to be made in the Common Gaol for the District of Quebec.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the further Sum of Three hundred and eleven Pounds, three shillings and eight pence, Currency expended and to be expended for certain necessary Hydraulic Works in the said Common Gaol, shall be charged against the unappropriated monies aforesaid.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that a further sum not exceeding eight hundred and twenty-five pounds, currency, shall be taken and applied as aforesaid, from and out of the unappropriated monies aforesaid, towards altering the building adjacent

to the said Common Gaol erected for a stepping Mill, and converting the said Building into a Prison and a House of Correction.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of the proper Officer to lay before the three branches of-the Legislature, at the next Session, within fifteen days after the opening thereof, a detailed statement of the manner in which the aforesaid sums shall have been applied and expended.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the Monies appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
