An Act to carry into effect the purpose of part of a certain Act of the Legislature of this Province, as far as the same respects the erection of a Gaol and Court-Hall at Percé, and to repeal in part the said Act.

(7th March, 1827.)

Proamble.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the ninth section Repeal of the 9th section of of the said Act of the forty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, George Geo. 111, cap. the Third, intituled, "An Act for erecting Common Gaols with Court-Halls in "the Inferior District of Gaspé," by which section it is enacted and provided, that the money by the said Act appropriated for building the said Gaol and Court-Hall, should be taken out of the unappropriated monics from the rates and duties imposed and payable under and by virtue of an Act, intituled, "An Act to "provide for the erecting of a Common Gaol in each of the Districts of "Quebec and Montreal respectively, and the means for defraying the expenses " thereof," shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due applito this Majesty cation of the money hereby appropriated shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.

CAP. XVI.

An Act to continue, for a limited time, two Acts therein-mentioned, relating to the Inspection of Fish and Oil intended for exportation.

(7th March, 1827.)

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient to continue still further, for a limited time, an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An " Act to provide for the Inspection of Fish and Oil intended for exportation " from the Ports of Quebec and Montreal," as also an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to extend the provisions of a " certain Act therein-mentioned, relating to the Inspection of Fish and Oil " intended for exportation," the duration of which said Acts respectively is lilimited to the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven; Be it therefore enacted by the King's First Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to re-" peal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's " Reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Go-" vernment of the Province of Quebec, in North America;" and to make further Continuation " provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted of the Acts 3d. by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the third year of His Cap. 16 & 23. Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the inspection of Fish and " Oil intended for exportation from the ports of Quebec and Montreal," and the said Act passed in the fourth year of the Reign of His Majesty, intituled, " An Act to extend the provisions of a certain Act therein-mentioned, relating " to the Inspection of Fish and Oil intended for exportation," and all and every the matters and things in the said Acts severally mentioned and contained, shall still further continue to be and remain in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, and no longer.
