

Fines under this Act, how to be applied and accounted for, &c. XIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all fines imposed and levied in virtue of the present Act, shall be applied to the public uses of the said Province, and towards the support of the Government thereof, and the same shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall please to direct.

Duration of this Act. XIV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall remain in force until the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and no longer.

C A P. IV.

AN ACT relating to the Wardens of the House of Industry in the City of Montreal.

(7th March, 1827.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient that four of the Wardens for the House of Industry in the City of Montreal should annually retire and be replaced by an equal number ; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " *An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America ;*" and to " make further provision for the Government of the said Province ;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the Corporation of the Wardens of the House of Industry in the City of Montreal, shall, from and after the first day of April next, consist of eight Wardens, all of whom shall in the first instance be appointed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, of whom four shall, in the manner provided in the second clause or section of the Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to establish a " House of Industry in the City of Montreal," annually retire and be replaced in rotation by the like number, the first four to retire by ballot on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, and to be replaced, and so on the like day every following year, the same number retiring shall be replaced by the like number.

Governor to appoint eight Wardens, four of whom shall annually retire and be replaced in rotation by the like number.

II.

Duty of the Clerk of the Peace and of the Grand Jury of the District of Montreal.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be the duty of the Clerk of the Peace of the District of Montreal, annually, at the general session of the Peace for the said District, in the April Term, to notify the Grand Jury of the duty imposed upon them by the second section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty, and the Grand Jury shall, annually, at the said term accordingly nominate four persons qualified as in and by the said section it is provided and enacted, who shall, upon the retirement of those they are intended to replace, immediately enter on office.

C A P. V.

AN ACT to establish the manner of issuing Licences on which Duties are imposed by any Laws in force in this Province.

(7th March, 1827.)

Preamble.

Licences imposing duties to be issued under the Seal at Arms of the Governor, &c. certified by such person as he shall appoint to affix the same, and under the signature of the Secretary of the Province, &c.

WHEREAS it is expedient to establish the manner of issuing Licences upon which Duties are imposed by any Law in force in this Province: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America*;" and to make further "provision for the Government of the said Province:" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, all Licences to be granted by the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, under any Law now in force in this Province imposing duties thereon, shall be issued under the Seal at Arms of the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, certified by such person as the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, shall appoint to affix the same, and under the signature of the Secretary of the Province, or of the person executing the office of the Secretary of the Province, for the time being, any law, usage or custom to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
