7 George IV – Chapter 18

An Act authorizing a certain sum of money therein-mentioned to be refunded to John S. Baldwin and Julius Quesnel. (7th March, 1827.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient and just that a certain sum of money paid by John S. Baldwin and Julius Quesnel, as duties under an Act passed in the fifty-third year of the Reign of His late Majesty, George the Third, chapter eleven; should be refunded to them, the same having been paid contrary to the true intent and meaning of the said Act: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the u Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province, for the time being, by Warrant under his hand, to refund out of the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver-General of the Province, the sum of two hundred and seventy-four pounds, fourteen shillings and four pence, currency to the said John S. Baldwin and Julius Quesnel, being for so much exacted from and paid by them as duties under an Act passed in the fiftythird year of the Reign of His late Majesty, George the Third, chapter eleven, contrary to the true intent and meaning of the said Act.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the aforesaid sum of money hereby authorized to be refunded, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall direct.
