## An Act declaratory lo explain the provisions of an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter thirty-one, relating to Elementary Schools in this Province. (7th March, 1827.)

Whereas it is expedient to explain an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter thirty-one: Be it, therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby declared and enacted by the authority of the same, that in all cases where any Fabrique in this Province hereafter shall acquire, whether by Donation, Legacy or purchase, any Land or Tenement not exceeding in the whole one superficial acre in extent, upon which there may be a House or Edifice fit and proper for the purpose of a School, under an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to facilitate the Establishment and Endowment of Elementary Schools in the parishes in this Province," such Fabrique may hold and retain the said Land and Tenement with the House or Edifice thereon erected and being although, such house or edifice may exceed in value the annual income of fifty pounds, currency.
