2 William IV - Chapter 56

An Act to authorize the reimbursement of certain monies expended by Edouard Larue in distributing the printed copies of a certain Act therein mentioned. (25th February, 1832.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Whereas it is expedient to reimburse a certain sum of money expended by Edouard Larue of the City of Québec, in the performance of the services herein after mentioned, May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Québec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government, by warrant under his hand and out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, to cause to be paid to the said Edouard Larue, a sum of money not exceeding eighty-eight pounds, fourteen shillings and nine pence half-penny, currency, to reimburse a like sum by him expended in distributing the printed copies of a certain Act passed in the ninth and tenth years of the Reign of His late Majesty, and intituled, "An Act for rendering valid conveyances of Lands and other immoveable property held in free and common soccage within the Province of Lower Canada, and for other purposes therein mentioned," which Act was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure, and to which His Majesty's assent was signified by a Proclamation issued by His Excellency the Governor in Chief, on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Act shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct, and that a detailed account of the expenditure of all such monies shall be laid before the several branches of the Legislature within the first fifteen days of the next Session thereof.
