2 William IV – Chapter 7

An Act to extend the period limited by an Act passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter the third, for enregistering certain Acts or Deeds, in Law, or Instruments in Writing, therein-mentioned. (25th February, 1832.)

Whereas it is expedient to extend the period assigned and limited by the second Clause or Section of an Act passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter the Third, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act passed in the eleventh year of the Reign of His late Majesty, intituled, 'An Act to establish Registry Offices in the Counties of Drummond, Sherbrooke, Stanstead, Shefford, and Missiskoui [Saint-Armand], and to extend the provisions of the said Act,'" for enregistering certain Acts or Deeds in Law, or Instruments in Writing, mentioned in the said Clause or Section;—Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Québec, in North-America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the period assigned and limited by the said second Clause or Section of the before-mentioned Act passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter the third, for enregistering certain Acts or Deeds in Law, or instruments in Writing, in the said Clause or Section mentioned, shall further be and the same is hereby extended to the first day of May, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred, and thirty-three, and that all such Acts or Deeds in Law or Instruments in Writing, in the said Clause or Section mentioned and required to be enregistered, which shall not be enregistered in the manner therein provided before the said first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, shall be utterly void and of no effect whatsoever, against subsequent purchasers for a valuable consideration.
