VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that a detailed Acded to be laid count of the monies expended under the authority of this Act shall be laid before before the Assembly fifteen the Commons House of Assembly, within fifteen days after the opening of the days after the next Session of the Provincial Parliament.

VII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall be and remain in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and no longer.

CAP. X.

An AcT to extend the Benefit of the Trial by Jury.

(14th March, 1829.)

Preamble.

THEREAS by an Ordinance of the late Province of Quebec, made and passed in the twenty-fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King, George the Third, of Glorious Memory, intituled, " An Ordinance to regulate " the proceedings in the Courts of Civil Judicature, and to establish Trials by "Juries in actions of a commercial nature and personal wrongs to be compen-" sated in damages;" it is amongst other things enacted, "that all and every " person having suits at law and actions in any of the said Courts of Common " Pleas, grounded on debts, promises, contracts and agreements of Mercantile " nature only, between merchant and merchant, and trader and trader, so re-" puted and understood according to law, and also of personal wrongs proper to " be compensated in damages, may, at the opinion and choice of either party, " have and obtain the Trial and Verdict of a Jury, as well for the Assessment of " damages on personal wrongs committed, as the determination of matters of " fact in any such cause;" And whereas it is expedient to extend the benefit of the Trial by Jury; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the

the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, " intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteent " year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual " provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America;" and " to make further provision for the Government of the said Province." And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that in any personal action whatever in which remedy sought is compensation in damages, interest and costs only, for Wrongs sus some wrong sustained by reason of some délits or quasi délits, to moveable property tained by reason of delits or only it shall and may be lawful to and for the plaintiff, and plaintiffs, defendant and quasi delits. Plaintiffs and desendants therein, and to, and for either of them at his, her or their option and Defendants choice, to have and obtain the Trial and Verdict of a Jury, as well for the determay have and obtain the mination of matters of fact as for the Assessment of damages in such action in due trial and verdict of a jury. course of law, and in manner and form as to all things directed and provided by the Ordinance herein-before recited.

CAP. XI.

An Acr for the better regulation of the Lumber Trade.

(14th March 1829.)

Preamble.

HEREAS the different Acts of the Provincial Legislature by which the Lumber Trade of the Province was regulated have expired; and whereas it is expedient to make Legislative Provisions for the regulation of the said Trade and of the matters concerning the same :- Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Par-Governor liament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act empowered to " passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for appoint cermaking more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec,
tain skilful persons to be in North America," and for making further provision for the Government of the master curiers and measurers said Province." And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that of boards, &c. from and after the passing of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor, stitute a board Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of the Province of examiners.
