An Act to encrease the number of Assessors for the Cities of Quebec and Montreal.

(14th March, 1829.)

Preamble.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Grand Jury of Quebec and for the Districts of Quebec and Montreal, shall annually, in the manner by the present a list said Act appointed, make and present to the Court a list of twenty persons quabe appointed lifted to be Assessors for the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and that the said Court shall annually appoint twelve of the persons named thereon to be Assessors to serve for one year, according to the provisions of the aforesaid Act. Provided always, that for the present year only, the powers given by law to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and to the Grand Jury at the said Court, with regard to the appointment of the said Assessors may be exercised at the Session of the Court of Quarter Sessions to be holden in the month of April next.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for the Assessors, so to be appointed, to make such division among themselves of the work to be done, in making the assessment, as they shall find most conve-Provided that no portion of such assessment shall be deemed to have been

been sufficiently made, unless the same shall have been made by at least three of the said Assessors, and that in all cases where three of them, and no more, may have proceeded to make such assessment, and a difference of opinion among them may have occurred, the assessment shall be deemed to have been sufficiently made if two of them have concurred in opinion, and have certified and signed the estimate, as required by the aforesaid Act.

Continuance of this Act.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall be and continue in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, and no longer.

CAP. XVII.
