AN ACT to appropriate a certain Sum of Money therein-mentioned, towards the support of the Emigrant Hospital established in Quebec.

(14th March, 1829.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

HEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a sum of Money for the relief of Indigent Sick Emigrants, arriving at Quebec from the United Kingdom, as well as for other indigent sick persons labouring under contagious diseases; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted
