

Reign, Chapter fourth, the duration of which Act is limited to the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,*" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province ;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that all the provisions contained in the second and third sections of the said Act passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter four, intituled, "An Act for more particularly ascertaining the damages on protested Bills of Exchange in the Province of Lower-Canada, and to suspend, for a limited time, certain parts of the Ordinance therein-mentioned," shall be and the same are hereby extended to all Bills of Exchange sold or negotiated within the Province, although the same may not have been drawn on or by any person residing therein.

Provisions contained in 2d & 3d. sections of the Act 6 Geo. 4, cap. 4, extended to Bills of Exchange sold or negotiated within this Province.

Act 6 Geo. 4, cap. 4, as amended by the present Act, continued.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Act last above-mentioned, as amended by the present Act, shall be, and the same is hereby continued in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and no longer.

C A P. II.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain Sum of Money therein-mentioned, towards the support of the Emigrant Hospital established in Quebec.

(14th March, 1829.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a sum of Money for the relief of Indigent Sick Emigrants, arriving at Quebec from the United Kingdom, as well as for other indigent sick persons labouring under contagious diseases ; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted

constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province ;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, by a Warrant or Warrants, under his hand, from time to time, as occasion may require, to advance from and out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, during the present year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, towards the support of the Hospital established in the City of Quebec, for the relief of Indigent Sick Emigrants from the United Kingdom, pursuant to an Act of the Legislature of this Province, passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money therein-mentioned, for the relief of Indigent Sick Emigrants from the United Kingdom," a sum not exceeding in the whole the sum of seven hundred pounds, currency.

£760 advanced for the Emigrant Hospital at Quebec.

An Account of the Expenditure of the money so granted, to be laid before the Legislature.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the persons under whose direction and superintendance the money appropriated by this Act shall be laid out and expended, shall in the course of fifteen days after the opening of the next Session of the Legislature, lay before the three Branches thereof, a detailed and full statement of the manner in which such money shall have been laid out and expended.

Application of the money to be accounted for to His Majesty.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the money appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct.

C A P . III.

AN ACT to exempt from seizure in satisfaction of Judgment, the Bedding and necessary Wearing Apparel of Debtors.

(14th March 1829.)

WHEREAS it is expedient that not only the Bed and Bedding of Debtors should be exempt from being seized and sold in execution of Judgments,
