Commissioners to render an account to the Legislature. V. Application of the money to be accounted for to the His Majesty. VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Act shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct.

AN ACT further to provide for a limited time for the want of Notaries in the County of Gaspé.

(14th March, 1829.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS for supplying the want of Notaries in the County of Gaspé, it is expedient again to continue for a limited time the tenth Clause or Section of an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter fifteen, which said Clause or Section by an Act of the seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter one is limited to the first day of July next: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign; intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of* " the:
