to Petrus Noiscux, of the town of Three-Rivers, as a remuneration for his services in making a Survey, Plan, and Estimate with reference to the said Bridge.

Application of the money to be accounted for to His Majesty.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of all the monies advanced, under the authority of this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall direct.

## CAP. XLIV.

An Acr to appropriate a sum of money for the payment of certain Militia Officers, for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

(26th March, 1830.)

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Preamble.

HEREAS it is necessary to provide for the expenses of the Militia of this Province, for the present year one thousand eight hundred and thirty: May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making " more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North " America;" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Pro-"vince;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government, by Warrant or Warrants under his hand, to order that out of the unappropriated monies in the bands of the Receiver-General of this Province, or which may hereafter come into his hands, there be paid the sums hereinafter mentioned, to the Officers of Militia hereinafter mentioned, and for certain contingent expences of the Militia for the present year one thousand eight hundred and thirty, that is to say: For the salary of the Adjutant-General of Militia, four hundred and fifty pounds sterling: For the salary of the Deputy Adjutant-General of Militia, two hundred and seventy pounds sterling: For the salary of the Provincial Aide-de-Camp, three hundred and sixty pounds sterling: For the salary

of the Clerk in the office of the Adjutant-General of Militia, one hundred and twenty-three pounds three shillings and nine pence sterling: For the salary of the Messenger in the office of the Adjutant-General of Militia, sixty pounds four shillings and six pence sterling: For the Stationary, Printing and Postage of the Department of the Adjutant-General of Militia, two hundred pounds sterling.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall direct.

III. Provided always, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the foregoing provisions of this Act, shall not have any force or effect, unless during the present Session of the Legislature, an Act or Acts should be passed for regulating the Militia of this Province.

## CAP. XLV.

An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money therein mentioned, towards the support of the Emigrant Hospital established at Quebec.

(26th March, 1830.)

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a sum of money for the relief of indigent sick emigrants, arriving at Quebec from the United Kingdom as well as of other indigent sick persons labouring under contagious diseases: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the four-"teenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual "provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province; "And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand, from time to time as occasion may require,
