

hands, and the amount of the monies hereby appropriated to the purpose for which such advance shall have been made, remaining unexpended in the hands of the Receiver General; and that every such account shall be supported by vouchers therein distinctly referred to by numbers corresponding to the numbering of the items in such account, and shall be made up to, and closed on the tenth day of April, and tenth day of October in each year during which such expenditure shall be made, and shall be attested before a Justice of the Court of King's Bench, or a Justice of the Peace, and shall be transmitted to the officer whose duty it shall be to receive such account, within fifteen days next after the expiration of the said periods respectively.

Application of the money to be accounted for to His Majesty, and a detailed account to be laid before the Legislature.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Act shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall direct, and that a detailed account of the expenditure of all such monies shall be laid before the several branches of the Provincial Legislature, within the first fifteen days of the next Session thereof.

An Act to make provision for the subsistence of the Widow of the late Frederick Rolette.

[31st March, 1831.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble.

WE Your Majesty's Most dutiful and Loyal Subjects the Commons of Lower-Canada in Provincial Parliament assembled, having taken into consideration the Message of His Excellency the Governor in Chief, bearing date the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, representing the distress to which the Widow of the late Frederick Rolette, in his life time Captain in the Provincial Navy on Lake Huron, is subjected, and other circumstances mentioned in the said Message, and having resolved to grant Your Majesty the sum of seventy-five pounds sterling, annually, to enable Your Majesty to provide for the subsistence of the Widow of the said late Frederick Rolette, during the term of her natural life, do most humbly beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice

advice, and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,*" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that out of the unappropriated monies now in or that may hereafter come into the hands of the Receiver General of the Province, there shall be annually paid by a Warrant or Warrants under the hand of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province, the sum of seventy-five pounds, sterling money of Great Britain, to afford the means of subsistence to the Widow of the said late Frederick Rolette, during the term of her natural life.

II. An Act to authorize Edward Southouse Glen to build a Toll Bridge over the River Richelieu.

[31st March, 1831.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the erection of a Bridge over the River Richelieu, in the District of Montreal, at the place called Papineau's Ferry, near the Chambly Basin, would materially contribute to the convenience of the inhabitants of the adjacent Parishes; And whereas Edward Southouse Glen hath by his petition prayed for leave to build a Toll Bridge over the said River at the said place:—May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,*" and
