

council-man in each Ward shall retire from Office on the day which shall be fixed in the manner hereinbefore provided for holding the Elections of Common Council-men in and for the several Wards of the said City.

If the votes of the Common Council at any election of a Mayor for the City shall be equally divided the Senior Justice of the Peace, to declare the person most fit to be Mayor.

Continuance of this Act.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if the votes of the Common Council, at any Election of a Mayor of the said City, after the second Election of Common Council-men, shall be equally divided, the senior Justice of the Peace residing in the said City of Quebec, shall choose and declare such of the persons for whom the votes shall so have been equally divided as he shall think most fit to be the Mayor, and such person shall be the Mayor, accordingly.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall be and remain in force until the expiration of the Act hereinbefore cited and no longer.

C A P. VII.

An Act to amend and extend the Provisions of an Act intituled, "An Act for making a Rail Road from Lake Champlain to the River Saint Lawrence."

(3d April, 1833.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to extend certain provisions of an Act passed in the last Session of the present Parliament, for making a Rail Road from Lake Champlain to the River Saint Lawrence, and to amend the said Act: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, the period within which the Company of Proprietors shall be bound to construct and complete the said Rail Road, shall be extended to four years from the day of the passing of this Act, instead of the period mentioned in the forty-seventh Section of the said Act; and that the Book and Plan required by the said Act, and which by the provisions of the said Section were to be prepared and deposited of Record, within twelve months after the passing of the

Extension of time granted to the Company of Proprietors for completing the Rail Road from Lake Champlain to the River St. Lawrence.

Provisn. the Act herein above cited, may be prepared and deposited as aforesaid, at any time before the first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty four. Provided that the said Company shall be bound to conform to the provisions of the twelfth Section of the Act herein above cited, within four years from the passing of this Act.

C A P. VIII.

AN ACT to revive and continue a certain Act concerning Fraudulent Debtors.

[3d April, 1833.]

Preamble.

Act 9. Geo.
IV. cap. 27,
revived and
continued.

WHEREAS it is expedient to re-establish and revive a certain Act passed in the ninth year of the Reign of George the Fourth, Chapter twenty seven, which expired on the first day of May last ;—Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,*" and to " make further provision for the Government of the said Province," And it is hereby enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Act which is intituled, " An Act to prevent fraudulent Debtors evading their Creditors in certain parts " of the Province," which ceased to be in force on the first day of May last, shall be and is hereby revived, and shall be and remain in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, and no longer.

C A P. IX.

An Act for improving the Internal Navigation of this Province.

WHEREAS it is expedient to ascertain whither it is practicable to improve the Navigation of the River Saint Lawrence in Steam-Boats or other Vessels between Lachine and the line which separates this Province from the Province of Lower
