9 George IV – Chapter 1

An Act to make perpetual the Act of the Sixth George the Fourth, Chapter fourth, intituled, “An Act for more particularly ascertaining the damages on protested Bills of Exchange in the Province of Lower- Canada, and to suspend, for a limited time, certain parts of the Ordinance therein-mentioned.” (14th. March, 1829.)

Whereas it is expedient to amend and continue still further for a limited time, a certain Act passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter fourth, the duration of which Act is limited to the first clay of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of tire Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, “An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, ‘An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,’ and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;” and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that all the provisions contained in the second and third sections of the said Act passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter four, intituled, “An Act for more particularly ascertaining the damages on protested Bills of Exchange in the Province of Lower-Canada, and to suspend, for a limited time, certain parts of the Ordinance therein-mentioned,” shall be and the same are hereby extended to all Bills of Exchange sold or negotiated within the Province, although the same may not have been drawn on or by any person residing therein.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Act last above-mentioned, as amended by the present Act, shall be, and the same is hereby continued in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and no longer.
