9 George IV – Chapter 31

An Act to revive an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to authorize the sale and disposal of certain goods unclaimed and remaining in the possession of the Clerks of the Peace of this Province, and further to continue, for a limited time, the said Act." (14th March, 1829.)

Whereas an Act was passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to authorize the sale and disposal of certain Goods unclaimed and remaining in the possession of the Clerks of the Peace in this Province," which Act has expired; And whereas it is expedient that the said Act be revived and continued in force for a limited time: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to authorize the sale and disposal of certain Goods unclaimed and remaining in the possession of the Clerks of the Peace in this Province," with all the clauses, provisions, powers, authorities, directions, regulations and every matter and thing therein contained, shall be and the same is hereby revived and shall be and remain in full force and authority in as full and ample manner to all intents and purposes, as if the same were recited and re-enacted in the Body of this Act, until the first day of May, which will be in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and no longer.
