9 George IV – Chapter 35

An Act to continue further, for a limited time, a certain Act concerning the Beaches and Landing Places in Quebec. (14th March, 1829.)

Whereas it is expedient further to continue, for a limited time, a certain Act passed in the seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide Regulations, concerning the Beaches or Strands and Landing Places in Quebec," the duration of which Act is limited to the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled 'an Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter eleven, intituled, "An Act to provide Regulations concerning the Beaches or Strands and Landing Places in Quebec," shall further continue to be and remain in full force and effect until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and no longer.
