9 George IV – Chapter 43

An Act to further amend an Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty, George the Third, intituled, "An Act to establish a House of Industry, in the City of Montreal." (14th March, 1829.)

Whereas an Act was passed in the fifty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled, "An Act to establish a House of Industry in the City of Montreal," and the same was amended by an Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His present Majesty George the Fourth chapter the sixth, but it has been by experience found insufficient for the purpose intended by reason of the death or removal of Wardens, and because of the ordinary Quorum thereby established, consisting of a greater number of Wardens than generally could be assembled, for remedy whereof, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that twelve instead of eight Wardens of the said House of Industry shall be named and appointed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, whereof six shall retire by rotation, and be replaced by an equal number, at the expiration of every two succeeding years as in and by the first mentioned Act of the fifty-eighth George the Third is prescribed, so that the Corporation of the "Wardens of the House of Industry in the City of Montreal," may hereafter consist of twelve Wardens, and not less; and the Quorum thereof, for the transaction of ordinary business shall hereafter consist of three wardens instead of five as heretofore. Provided always that at all times when it shall be expedient to purchase or sell any lands, tenements, real or immoveable estates, rents, usufruits, servitudes or hereditaments for the said Institution, the meeting of the said Wardens called for such purpose shall consist of seven members at the least, including the President.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act the abovesaid Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His present Majesty, George the fourth, chapter the sixth, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
