9 George IV – Chapter 49

An Act further to continue, for a limited time, an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to erect certain Townships therein-mentioned, into an Inferior District, to be called the Inferior District of Saint Francis, and to establish Courts of Judicature therein." (14th March, 1829.)

Whereas it is expedient further to continue, for a limited time, an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act, to erect certain Townships therein-mentioned, into an Inferior District to be called the Interior District of Saint Francis, and to establish Courts of Judicature therein," the duration whereof is limited to the first day of May, of the present year, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to erect certain Townships therein-mentioned into an Inferior District to be called the Inferior District of Saint Francis, and to establish Courts of Judicature therein," and all and every the matters and things therein-mentioned and contained shall further continue to be and remain in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act may be altered, amended or repealed in the present Session.
