9 George IV – Chapter 62

**An Act to indemnify Antoine Gilbert Douglas for certain expenses by him incurred about the road from Saint Gregoire to the Township of Kingsey. (14th March, 1829.)**

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas Antoine Gilbert Douglas, Esq. of the Township of Aston, in the District of Three Rivers [Trois-Rivières], has expended in the making and completing of a certain road from the Parish of Saint Gregoire to the Township of Kingsey, in the said District, a large sum of his own money over and above the sum appropriated by the Legislature for the making and completing of the said road, and whereas it is just and equitable that the said sum Antoine Gilbert Douglas should be indemnified therefore; May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His cc Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that there shall be paid to the said Antoine Gilbert Douglas, by Warrant under the hand of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, a sum of money not exceeding two hundred pounds currency, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of the Province.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the said monies shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
