10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 12

**An Act to appropriate a certain sum of Money to pay the Salaries and Allowance of the Tide Waiters, at the Port of Quebec. (26th March, 1830.)**

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a certain sum of money for the purpose of paying the Salaries and allowance of the Waiters at the Port of Quebec. May it please your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and for making further provision for the government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government, to pay by Warrant or Warrants under his hand, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, the following sums, that is to say: A sum not exceeding fifty pounds currency to each of the two established Tide Waiters at the Port of Quebec, being the amount of their respective Salaries for the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine: a sum not exceeding fifty pounds currency, to each of the two established Tide Waiters at the Port of Quebec, being the amount of their respective salaries for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty; and such further sum as may be necessary for the purpose of paying to the Tide Waiters, respectively, an allowance of five shillings a day, for every day they shall be actually employed on board any vessel, after the passing of this Act, and during the present year one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the Monies hereby appropriated shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
