10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 20

An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money, to reimburse a sum advanced by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, for the Repairs of the Court-House, at Quebec, and for continuing and completing the said repairs. (26th March, 1830.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a certain sum of money, to reimburse certain sums advanced by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, for repairs done at the Court-House in the City of Quebec, and to provide the means of continuing the said repairs: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and Assembled by virtue of and under the authority of ah Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;' and for making further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver-General, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government, to take a sum not exceeding five hundred and fifty pounds currency, to be applied in the following manner, that is to say: a sum not exceeding two hundred pounds currency, to reimburse a like sum advanced by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, for the repairs at the Court House in the City of Quebec, and a sum not exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds currency for continuing and completing the said repairs.

- II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies hereby appropriated shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
- III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that a detailed account of the monies expended under the authority of this Act, shall be laid before the Assembly of this Province, within fifteen days after the opening of the next Session of the Provincial Legislature.
