10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 21

An Act to continue for a limited time a certain Act passed in the seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act more effectually to provide for the maintenance of good order in Churches, Chapels and other places of Public Worship, and for other purposes therein mentioned." (26th March, 1830.)

Whereas it is expedient to continue for a limited time, a certain Act passed in the seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act more effectually to provide for the maintenance of good order in Churches, Chapels and other places of Public Worship, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision, for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act more effectually, to provide for the maintenance of good order in Churches, Chapels and other places of Public Worship and for other purposes therein mentioned" shall remain, in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four and no longer.
