10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 33

An Act to appropriate a certain sum of Money for the purchase or erection of a Custom House in the City of Quebec. (26th March, 1830.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient that a fit and proper building be purchased or erected in the Lower Town of the City of Quebec to be the Custom House of the said City: May it therefore please your Majesty, that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government, to purchase or, to cause to be erected in such part of the Lower Town of the City of Quebec, as to him shall appear most advantageous a fit and proper building with the necessary appurtenances thereto to be the Custom House of the said City of Quebec and by Warrant or Warrants under his hand to authorize the payment, of a sum not exceeding six thousand pounds currency, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General for defraying the cost of the said Building and appurtenances or the expenses attending the erection thereof.

II. And it is further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of all monies expended by virtue of this Act shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct.
