10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 34

**An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money towards the erection of a Light-House on the Island of Saint Paul, and to provide for the maintenance thereof. (26th March, 1830.)**

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient that a Light-House should be erected on the Island of Saint Paul, at the entrance of the Gulf of Saint Lawrence, at the joint expense of this Province, and of the Provinces of Nova-Scotia, New-Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that a sum not exceeding two thousand pounds currency, of the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver-General shall be, and is hereby placed at the disposal of the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government, to enable him conjointly with the Governments of the said Provinces of Nova-Scotia, New-Brunswick and Prince Edward's Island, to cause a Light-House to be erected on the Island of Saint Paul, at the entrance of the Gulf of Saint Lawrence aforesaid.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that one half of the annual expense incurred in maintaining and keeping in repair the said Light-House, shall be payable by this Province, and shall be defrayed out of the Funds of the Trinity House of Quebec, appropriated by law to the improvement of the navigation of the River Saint Lawrence.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his heirs and successors shall be pleased to direct.
