10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 45

An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money therein mentioned, towards the support of the Emigrant Hospital established at Quebec. (26th March, 1830.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a sum of money for the relief of indigent sick emigrants, arriving at Quebec from the United Kingdom as well as of other indigent sick persons labouring under contagious diseases: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;'" and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand, from time to time as occasion may require, to advance from and out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver-General during the present year, one thousand eight hundred and thirty towards the support of the Hospital established in the City of Quebec, for the relief of indigent sick emigrants from the United Kingdom, pursuant to an Act of the Legislature of this Province, passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to appropriate a certain sum of money therein mentioned, for the relief of indigent sick Emigrants from the United Kingdom," a sum not exceeding in the whole, seven hundred pounds currency.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the persons under whose direction and superintendence the money appropriated by this Act shall be laid out and expended, shall within fifteen days after the opening of the next Session of the Legislature, lay before the several branches thereof, a detailed and full statement of the manner in which such monies shall have been laid out and expended.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct.
