10 & 11 George IV – Chapter 46

An Act to appropriate a certain sum of Money as an aid to the Corporation of the General Hospital, at Montreal. (26th March, 1830.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate a sum of Money as an aid to the corporation of the General Hospital at Montreal; May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government, of the Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province, to advance in the course of the present year by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of the Province, a sum not exceeding three hundred and eighty-five pounds currency, for the purpose of paying off a debt, incurred by the said corporation in the purchase of a lot of ground; and a further sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty pounds currency, as an aid to the said corporation for the current expences of the said corporation during the present year, of the application and expenditure of which said sums of money, the said corporation shall render a detailed account and lay the same before the Legislature within fifteen days after the opening of the ensuing Session.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the application of the monies hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his- Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct.
