3 William IV – Chapter 11

An Act to continue two Acts therein mentioned for preventing the seizure of certain articles. (3d April, 1833)

Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of An Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the Act passed in the ninth year of the Reign of George the Fourth, Chapter three, intituled, "An Act to exempt from seizure in satisfaction of judgment the bedding and necessary wearing apparel of Debtors," the duration whereof is limited to the first day of May next, and a certain other Act passed in the first year of His present Majesty's Reign, Chapter four, and intituled, "An Act to exempt from seizure in satisfaction of judgment, certain articles therein mentioned," the duration of which is also limited to the first day of May next, shall continue to be in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred, and thirty-seven, and no longer.
