An Act to continue for a limited time a certain Act therein mentioned, relating to the collection of Duties at the Inland Ports of this Province. (3d April, 1833)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

May it please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Québec, in North America;' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the Act passed in the second year of His Majesty's Reign, chapter twenty-nine, intituled, "An Act to continue for a limited time, two certain Acts therein mentioned, relating to the collection of the Revenue at the Inland Ports of Entry in this Province, and to make further provision in that behalf" shall be and remain in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, and no longer.
