HEREAS it is expedient to appropriate a certain sum of money to defray the expence of causing the new Gaol at Montreal to be surrounded with sufficient sufficient walls and such additional work done to the same as may be necessary to

fit it for the reception of prisoners:—May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An " Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His " Majesty's Reign, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Govern-" ment of the Province of Quebec in North America," and to make further provision " for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government by Warrant under his hand and out of any money to the unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General to advance and pay to ers appointed the Commissioners appointed, or who may hereafter be appointed under the authority of the Act passed in the tenth and eleventh years of His late Majesty's Reign, Chapter thirty-one, intituled, "An Act to provide for the erection of a Common late Majesty's Gaol in the District of Montreal," such sum not exceeding the sum of one thousand five hundred and ninety-two pounds six shillings and one penny currency, as may be necessary to enable the said Commissioners to defray the expence of surrounding the said Gaol with proper walls and of such other additional work as may be required to render the said Gaol fit for the reception of prisoners.

Governor em. powered to advance a certain sum of Commission under an Act passed in the 10th and 11th years of His Reign, to defray the expense of surrounding the Gaol with wails.

A detailed account of the expenditure of the money to be attested before a Justice of the Court of King's Bench or before a Justice of the Peace.

II. And be itfurther enacted by the anthority aforesaid, that every person to whom shall be entrusted the expenditure of any portion of the monies hereby appropriated, shall make up detailed accounts of such expenditure, showing the sum advanced to the accountant, the sum actually expended, the balance (if any) remaining in his hands, and the amount of the monies hereby appropriated to the purpose for which such advance shall have been made, remaining unexpended in the hands of the Receiver General; and that every such account shall be supported by Vouchers therein distinctly referred to by numbers corresponding to the numbering of the items in such account; and shall be made up to, and closed on the tenth day of April and tenth day of October in each year, during which such expenditure shall be made, and shall be attested before a Justice of the Court of King's Bench, or before a Justice of the Peace; and shall be transmitted to the Officer whose duty it shall be to receive such account, within fifteen days next after the expiration of the said periods, respectively.
