4 William IV – Chapter 17

An Act to appropriate certain sums of money therein mentioned in aid of certain Charitable Institutions in the City of Montreal. (18th March, 1834.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Whereas it is expedient to appropriate certain sums of money in aid of the Institutions hereinafter mentioned, established in the City of Montreal:— May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province, by a Warrant or Warrants under his hand to advance and pay from time to time during the present year, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of the Province, the sums hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

A sum not exceeding one hundred pounds currency, as an aid to the Ladies of the Benevolent Society of Montreal, towards the support of the widows and orphans, under their protection.

A sum not exceeding one hundred pounds currency, as an aid to the Society of the Charitable Ladies of Montreal, towards the support of the orphans, under their charge.

A sum not exceeding fifty pounds currency, as an aid to the orphan asylum of Montreal.

And a sum not exceeding six hundred pounds currency, for the support of the Foundlings in the Hospital of the Grey Nuns at Montreal.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies appropriated by this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be pleased to direct, and that a detailed account of the expenditure of all such sums shall be laid, before the three branches of the Provincial Parliament, during the first fifteen days of the then next Session thereof.
