4 William IV – Chapter 18

**An Act to provide for the reimbursement of a certain sum of money advanced towards the support of the Quarantine Establishment at Grosse Isle, during the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and for other purposes therein mentioned. (18<sup>th</sup> March, 1834.)**

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Whereas it is expedient to make provision for the several purposes and objects hereinafter mentioned:—May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that a sum not exceeding four thousand two hundred and seventy-two pounds six shillings and sixpence, currency, to be taken out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, shall be and is hereby placed at the disposal of His Majesty, to reimburse a like sum advanced by the Civil Government of this Province, towards defraying the expences of the Quarantine Establishment at Grosse Isle during the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that a sum not exceeding seven hundred and six pounds and three pence currency, to be taken out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, shall be and is hereby placed at the disposal of His Majesty, to reimburse a like sum advanced by the Civil Government of this Province towards the support of the Emigrant Hospital at Quebec, during the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, over and above the amount collected under the authority of the Act passed in the second year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter seventeen, and appropriated by the said Act towards the support of the said Hospital.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor person administering the Government, by Warrant under his hand and out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, to advance and pay to the Committee of Management of the said Emigrant Hospital, a sum not exceeding five hundred pounds currency, to be applied towards paying the debts now due by the said Committee on account of the expences of the said Hospital and maintaining the same, and providing for the care and support of the patients therein, until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government, by Warrant under his hand and out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General, to pay to Samuel Brooks Rufus Laberee and Moses Nichols, a sum not exceeding ninety-five pounds eight shillings and one penny currency, to reimburse a like sum by them advanced, as Commissioners for the Dudswell and Ireland Road, over and above the sum appropriated by Law for the objects for which such sum was by them advanced.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every person to whom shall be entrusted the expenditure of any portion of the monies hereby appropriated, shall make up detailed accounts of such expenditure, showing the sum advanced to the Accountant, the sum actually expended, the balance, if any, remaining in his hands, and the amount of the monies hereby appropriated to the purpose for which such advance shall have been made, remaining unexpended in the hands of the Receiver General, and that every such account shall be supported by Vouchers therein distinctly referred to, by numbers corresponding to the numbering of the items in the said Account; and shall be made up to and closed on the tenth day of April and tenth day of October, in each year during which such expenditure shall be made, and shall be attested before a Justice of the Peace, and shall be transmitted to the Officer whose duty it shall be to receive such account, within fifteen days next after the expiration of the said periods respectively,

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the monies hereby appropriated, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct; and that a detailed account of the expenditure of all such monies shall be laid before the several Branches of the Provincial Legislature, within the first fifteen days of the next Session thereof.
