## An Act to make a certain Act passed for the relief of certain persons possessing Lands in the Township of Sherrington, a Public Act. (18<sup>th</sup> March, 1834.)

Whereas it is expedient that the Act hereinafter mentioned should be made a Public Act:— Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, 'An Act for making further provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act a certain Act passed in the third year of the Reign, of His late Majesty George the Fourth, chapter fourteen, and intituled, "An Act for the relief of certain Censitaires or Grantees of La Salle, and others therein mentioned possessing Lands within the limits of the Township of Sherrington," shall be and the said Act is hereby, made a public Act, and as such shall be judicially taken notice of by all Judges and Justices of the Peace and by all other persons whomsoever, without being specially pleaded.
