6 William IV – Chapter 43

An Act to continue for a limited time, two certain Acts therein mentioned concerning the Militia of this Province. (21st March, 1836.)

Whereas it is expedient further to continue for a limited time two certain Acts hereinafter mentioned, concerning the Militia of this Province, and the holding of Courts of Enquiry relative thereto:—Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America;' And to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that a certain Act passed in the tenth and eleventh years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, Chapter three, intituled, "An Act to provide for the better defence of the Province, and to regulate the Militia thereof," and certain other Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His present Majesty, Chapter forty-two, intituled, "An Act to authorise the appointing of Courts of Inquiry for investigating the qualification of Militia Officers, in certain cases," shall be, and they are hereby continued in force until the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and no longer.
