HIS MAJESTY'S PROVINCE OF

UPPER CANADA.

PASSED IN THE THIRD SESSION OF THE FOURTH PROVINCIAL PARLIAMENT OF UPPER CANADA, MET AT YORK, ON THE SECOND DAY OF FEBRUARY, IN THE FORTY-SEVENTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF OUR SOVEREIGN LORD GEORGE THE THIRD, AND PROROGUED ON THE TENTH DAY OF MARCH FOLLOWING.

CHAP. I.

An Ast for the Relief of Clerks to Attornies who may have served their Clerkships, without being bound by Contracts in Writing.

Passed 10th March, 1807.

THEREAS by Law no person can be admitted and involled as an Attorney of his Majesty's Court of King's Bench, unless such person shall have been bound by Contract in writing to serve as a Clerk, for and during the space of five years, to an Attorney duly sworn and admitted, and unless fuch person for and during the said term of five years, shall have continued in such service, and unless such person after the expiration of the said term of five years, shall be examined, sworn, admitted and involled as an Attor-Now for the relief of persons who have served for and during the space of five years, or who shall on or before the last day of Trinity Term, which shall be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight, have served for and during the space of five years as Clerks to Attornies, and have not been bound by Contracts in writing; Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, or before the constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act ity Term 1808, passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "an Act to repeal cer- besworn & adtain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's Reign, en-mitted attornies

CHAP. II.

An Act to repeal the several acts now in force giving Bounties for Destroying Wolves.

[Passed 10th March, 1807. An Act to regulate the payment of certain debts due by the Eastern District before
the establishment of the District of Johnstown.
