59 George III – Chapter 13

An Act to grant His Majesty a sum of Money to enable him to pay the Salary of the Inspector General of a public Provincial Accounts in this Province. (Passed 12th July, 1819.)

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas, it is expedient to provide a fund to enable your Majesty to pay the salary of the Inspector General of public Provincial Accounts of this Province; We your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects the Commons of Upper Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, beseech jour Majesty, that it may be enacted, and Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province." and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the rates and duties raised, levied, and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied, and collected, to and for the uses of this Province, and in the hands of the Receiver General, unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the sum of three hundred and sixty-five pounds, sterling, annually, which sum of three hundred and sixty-five pounds, sterling, and disposed of, in payment of the salary of the said Inspector General.

- II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of three hundred and sixty-five pounds, sterling, shall become payable from and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty.
- III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of three hundred and sixty-five pounds, sterling, shall be paid by the Receiver General of this Province, in discharge of such warrant or warrants as shall for that purpose be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, by the Receiver General of this Province, through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be graciously pleased to direct.
