**An Act for appropriating a sum of Money to defray the expence of procuring Plans and Elevations of Public Buildings, and for Copies of the Journals which were destroyed by the Enemy. (Passed 12th July, 1819.)**

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas, in pursuance of a joint Address of the Legislative Council and Commons House of Assembly of this Province, certain Plans and Elevations for Public Buildings were procured by the Provincial Agent; and whereas, it is expedient to appropriate a sum of money to defray the expences of the said Plans and Elevations; and whereas, a sum of money is required to defray the expence of procuring copies of the Journals of the Legislative Council and Assembly, which were burned by the enemy during the late war: We your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects the Commons of Upper Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, beseech your Majesty that it may be enacted, and Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the rates and duties already raised, levied, and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied, and collected, to and for the uses of this Province, there be granted to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the sum of five hundred and twelve pounds one shilling, sterling, to be issued out of the funds now remaining, or hereafter to come into the hands of the Receiver General, unappropriated, which said sum of five hundred and twelve pounds one shilling, shall be disposed of, appropriated, and applied by the Provincial Agent as follows, viz. one hundred and fifty-seven pounds ten shillings, sterling, to defray the expence of procuring certain Plans and Elevations for Public Buildings, procured by the Provincial Agent, and three hundred and fifty-four pounds eleven shillings, sterling, to defray the expences of procuring copies of the Journals of the Legislative Council and Assembly, which said sum of five hundred and twelve pounds one shilling, sterling, shall be paid in discharge of such warrant or warrants as shall for that purpose be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for by the Receiver General of this Province, through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall be graciously pleased to direct.
