An Act to repeal part of an Act passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to continue and amend an Act passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act to prevent damage to Travellers on the Highways in this Province." (Passed 12th July, 1819.)

Whereas, an Act passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to prevent damage to Travellers on the Highways in this Province," and continued and amended by an Act passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to continue and amend an Act passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act to prevent damage to Travellers on the Highways in this Province," will shortly expire; and whereas, it is expedient to make the said recited Acts permanent Laws of this Province; Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province off Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make1 further provision for the Government of the said Province." and by the authority of the same. That the last clause of the said last recited Act be, and the same is hereby repealed.
